

Write legibly, and be most particular about names, dates and places.

4.—Names of places and persons should be in block capitals, e.g., LONDON.

5.—Number your Reports so that you can readily quote them.

6.—Keep a copy of all important Reports. Carbonic Paper is placed in this book for this purpose. Write with a hard sharp-pointed pencil.

7.—Do not rely upon a single messenger for the safe delivery of a really important message. After a short interval, send a second or third man with a duplicate of the message; and send him, if possible, by another route.

8.—"Directions to messenger" should include the route he is to follow, pace at which he should travel, instructions as to waiting for an answer, etc., etc.
